⁴ Now there are varieties of gifts but the same Spirit, ⁵ and there are varieties of services but the same Lord, ⁶ and there are varieties of activities, but it is the same God who activates all of them in everyone. ⁷ To each is given the manifestation of the Spirit for the common good...

¹² For just as the body is one and has many members, and all the members of the body, though many, are one body, so it is with Christ. ¹³ For in the one Spirit we were all baptized into one body—Jews or Greeks, slaves or free—and we were all made to drink of one Spirit. ¹⁴ Indeed, the body does not consist of one member but of many...

²⁷ Now you are the body of Christ and individually members of it. ²⁸ And God has appointed in the church first apostles, second prophets, third teachers, then deeds of power, then gifts of healing, forms of assistance, forms of leadership, various kinds of tongues. ²⁹ Are all apostles? Are all prophets? Are all teachers? Do all work powerful deeds? ³⁰ Do all possess gifts of healing? Do all speak in tongues? Do all interpret? ³¹ But strive for the greater gifts. And I will show you a still more excellent way.

SACRAMENT OF HOLY BAPTISM

The baptismal party gathers at the font. Pastor addresses the assembly. God, who is rich in mercy and love, gives us a new birth into a living hope through the sacrament of baptism. By water and the Word, God delivers us from sin and death and raises us to new life in Jesus Christ. We are united with all the baptized in the one body of Christ, anointed with the gift of the Holy Spirit, and joined in God's mission for the life of the world.

Pastor addresses the parents:

Kelley and Daniel, called by the Holy Spirit, trusting in the grace and love of God, do you desire to have Jack baptized into Christ? If so, please respond "we do." *Response:* We do.

As you bring Jack to receive the gift of baptism, you are entrusted with responsibilities: to live with him among God's faithful people, bring him to the word of God and the holy supper, teach him the Lord's Prayer, the Creed, and the Ten Commandments, place in his hands the holy scriptures, and nurture him in faith and prayer, so that Jack may learn to trust God, proclaim Christ through word and deed, care for others and the world God made, and work for justice and peace. Do you promise to help Jack grow in the Christian faith and life? Please respond "we do." *Response:* We do.

Pastor addresses sponsors:

Robert and Joanna, you have been asked to fulfill the sacred responsibilities of godparents, that is baptismal sponsors. Do you promise to nurture Jack in the Christian faith as you are empowered by God's Spirit, and to help him live in the covenant of baptism and in communion with the church? Please respond "we do." *Response:* We do.

Pastor addresses the assembly:

People of God, do you promise to support Jack and pray for him in his new life in Christ?

We do.

PROFESSION OF FAITH

Assisting minister addresses parents and sponsors:
I ask you to profess your faith in Christ Jesus, reject sin, and confess the faith of the church. Do you renounce the devil and all the forces that defy God?
I renounce them.
Do you renounce the powers of this world that rebel against God?
I renounce them.
Do you renounce the ways of sin that draw you from God?
I renounce them.
Do you believe in God the Father?
I believe in God, the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth.

Do you believe in Jesus Christ, the Son of God? I believe in Jesus Christ, God's only Son, our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried; he descended to the dead. On the third day he rose again; he ascended into heaven, he is seated at the right hand of the Father, and he will come to judge the living and the dead.

Do you believe in God the Holy Spirit? I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting. Water is poured into the font.

We give you thanks, O God, for in the beginning your Spirit moved over the waters and by your Word you created the world, calling forth life in which you took delight. Through the waters of the flood you delivered Noah and his family, and through the sea you led your people Israel from slavery into freedom. At the river your Son was baptized by John and anointed with the Holy Spirit. By the baptism of Jesus' death and resurrection you set us free from the power of sin and death and raise us up to live in you.

Pour out your Holy Spirit, the power of your living Word, that those who are washed in the waters of baptism may be given new life. To you be given honor and praise through Jesus Christ our Lord, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, now and forever.

Amen.

BAPTISM

Water is poured on the candidate's head:

Jack Roger, I baptize you in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.

Amen.

You belong to Christ, in whom you have been baptized.

Let us pray. We give you thanks, O God, that through water and the Holy Spirit you give this your child, new birth, cleanse him from sin, and raise him to eternal life.

Laying both hands on the head of the newly baptized, the pastor prays: Sustain Jack with the gift of your Holy Spirit: the spirit of wisdom and understanding, the spirit of counsel and might, the spirit of knowledge and the love of the Lord, the spirit of joy in your presence, both now and forever. **Amen.** Pastor marks the sign of the cross on the forehead of the baptized saying: Jack Roger, child of God, you have been sealed by the Holy Spirit and marked with the + cross of Christ forever. Amen.

Assisting minister hands a lit candle to the sponsors, saying: Jesus said, I am the light of the world. Whoever follows me will have the light of life.

Pastor addresses the congregation

Let us welcome the newly baptized. We welcome you into the body of Christ and into the mission we share: join us in giving thanks and praise to God and bearing God's creative and redeeming word to all the world.

PRAYERS OF INTERCESSION

Challenged by God's Word in Christ, let us pray for the church, the world, and the whole creation. I invite you into a prayerful posture of kneeling, standing, or sitting.

A brief silence.

God of our ancestors, we give thanks for the church in all times. May we listen for the prophets of this age who bear messages that stir the church toward renewal and justice. Lead us all to experience oneness with each other and oneness with you. God of grace, **hear our prayer**.

Creator of every creature on earth, direct our lives toward the renewal and sustaining of the earth. Reveal the ways we can work alongside creation for the health and wellbeing of all. Inspire us to have the vision of St. Francis and see all people, all animals, and all creation as our sisters and brothers in Christ. God of grace, **hear our prayer**. Sovereign God, we give thanks that you are mindful and benevolent to us. Accompany us when hardness of heart gets in the way of justice between people and nations. Endow leaders with minds for justice and hearts for compassion. God of grace, **hear our prayer.**

Restoring Lord, grant healing and wholeness to those who are sick and suffering. Work through medical professionals to diagnose, ease pain, and give life to all who seek their wisdom and care. God of grace, **hear our prayer.**

God of life, shepherd those who are newly baptized. Especially we pray for Jack Roger Dickinson and his family. May his life be filled with your blessings, may he grow up to know and love you, and may he be a blessing to the world. God of grace, **hear our prayer**.

Unifying God, may your love inspire us to build supportive communities of faith where all are cherished. Bless the fellowship ministries of this congregation: St. Matthew's fellowship committee and events, coffee hour ministry, women's group, men's group, church historians, and all gatherings where members are able to be the Body of Christ together. God of grace, **hear our prayer**.

Into your hands, O God, we commend all for whom we pray, trusting in the saving grace you freely give, both now and forever. **Amen.**



INVITATION TO COMMUNION


